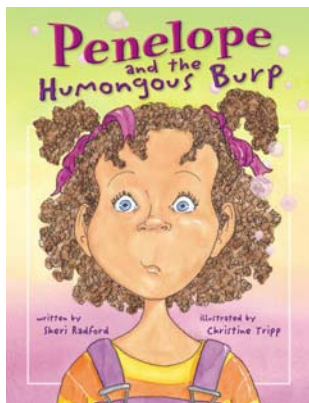


What Type of Talk Is Best for Your Students?

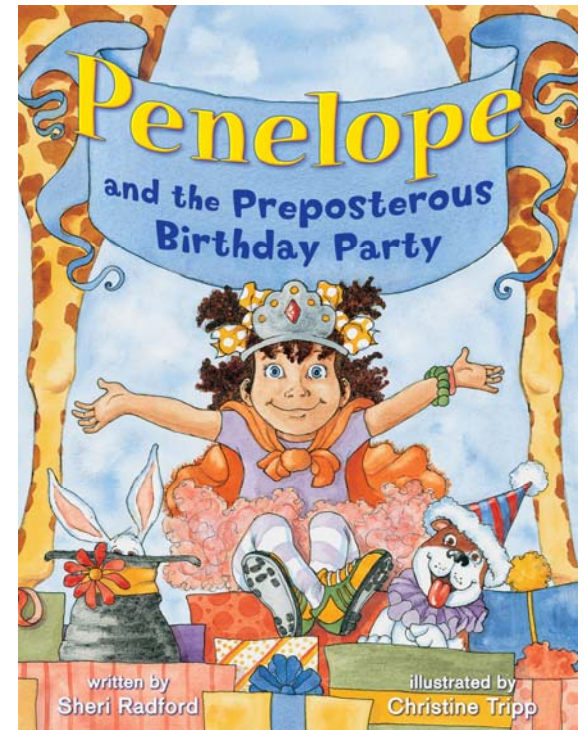

Penelope & the Preposterous Birthday Party

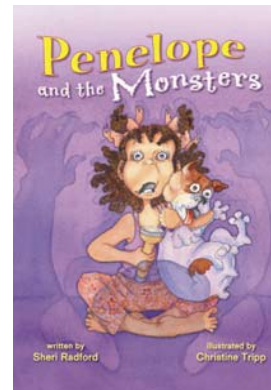
