"British Columbia takes a lot of pride and care in protecting the environment." Reardon has been living here for about a decade, during which time he's indulged his passions for hiking, running, observing nature and, above all, scuba diving: "You can drive 15 or 20 minutes outside of Vancouver and be in some of the best diving in the world."
