When Giacomo Puccini's Madama Butterfly (page 56) premiered in 1904, it bombed. Undeterred, Puccini set to work revising it. His fifth version of the opera is now considered the standard. Beloved worldwide, it has inspired works as diverse as the Broadway musical Miss Saigon, the 1987 film Fatal Attraction and Weezer's alt-rock album Pinkerton.
