Owned by chef Douglas Chang, whose impressive resume includes stints at Sai Woo (page 32) and West (page 69), Ai & Om also offers sharpening services and knife-skills classes and workshops. Definitely a cut above.



Something to Crow About

Vancouver's best-known crow is named Canuck, and he's famous for unbirdlike activities such as commuting on the SkyTrain and riding a skateboard.
